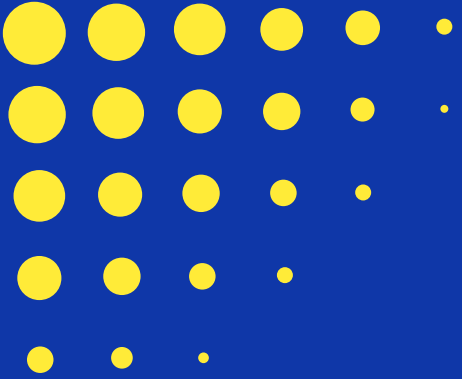
Background

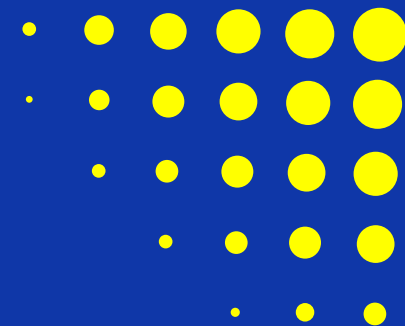

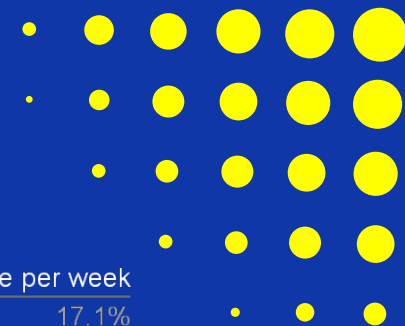

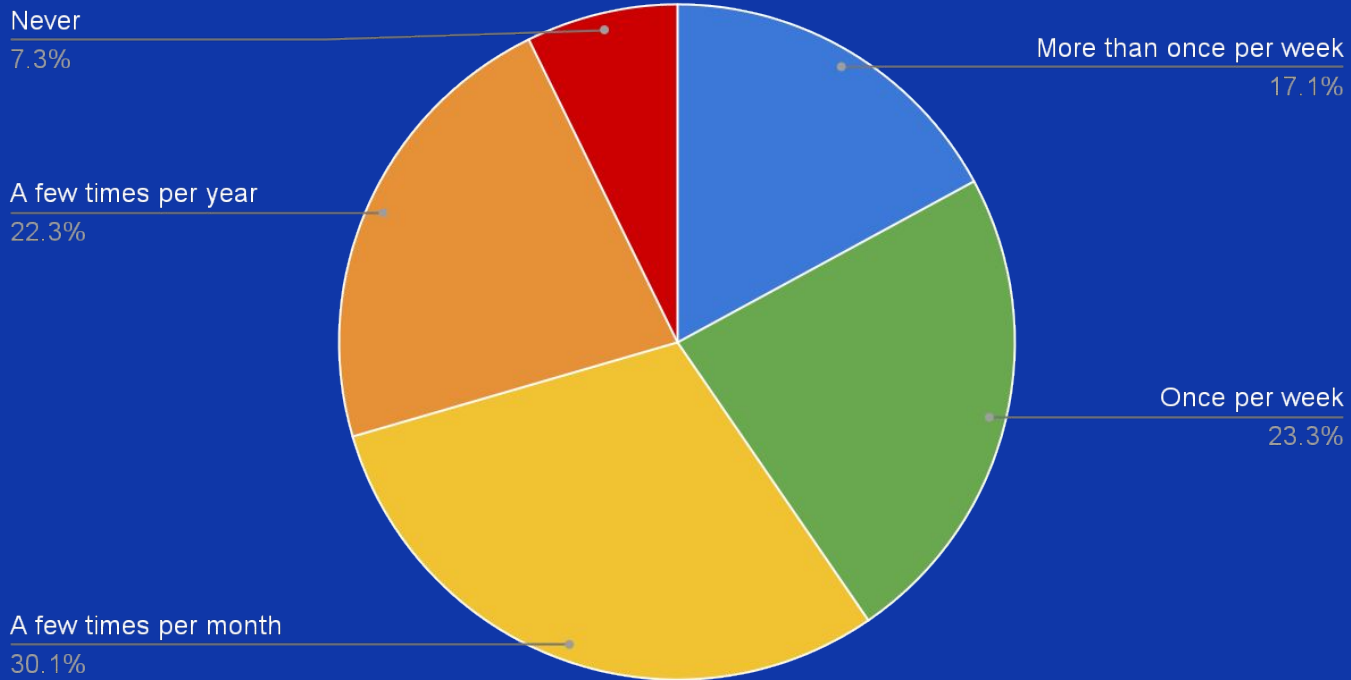

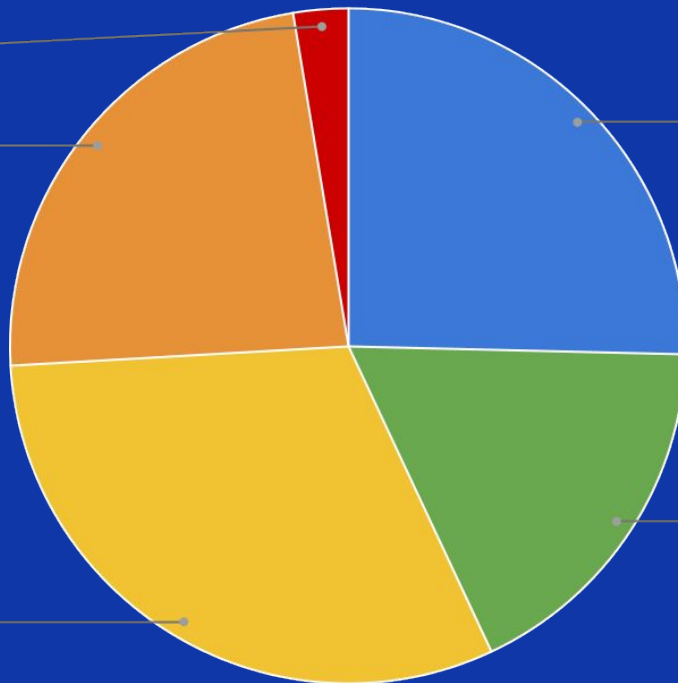

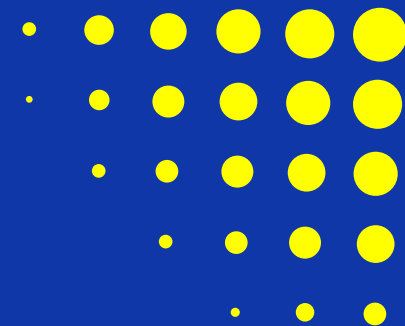

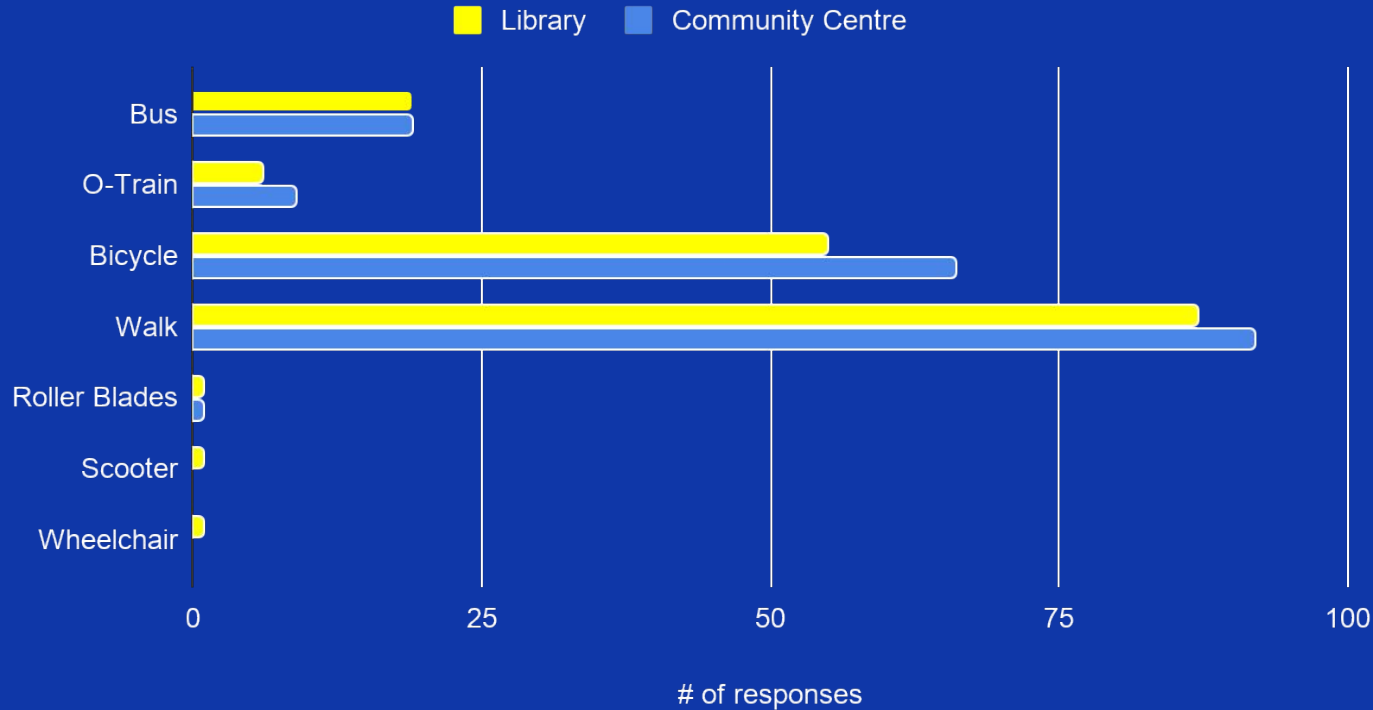

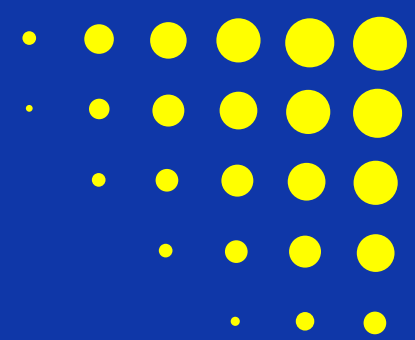

Roller Blades, Scooter, Wheelchair were write-in answers and may be more popular than they appear



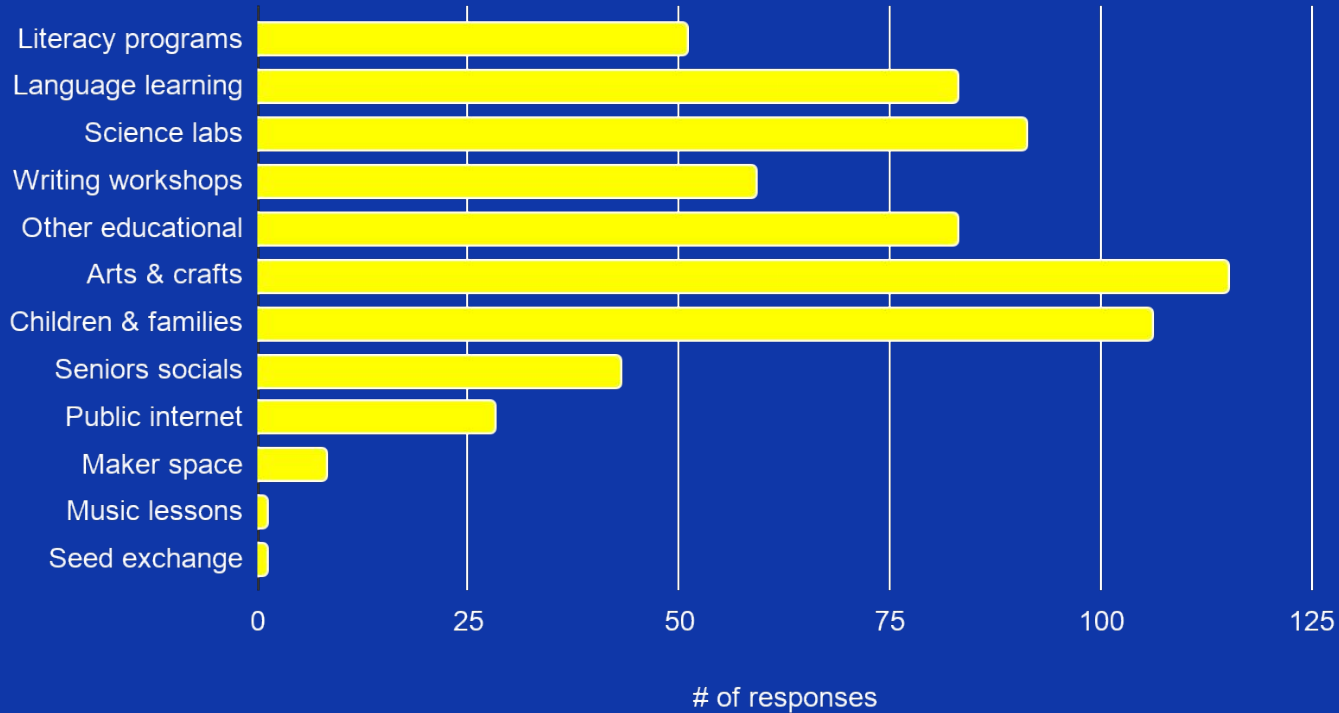

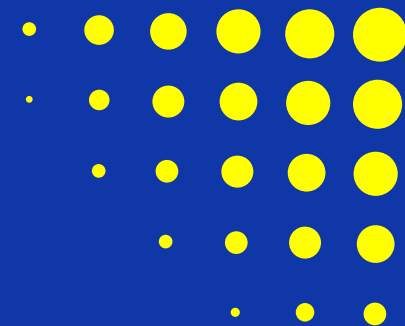

A maker space was a very popular write-in answer!

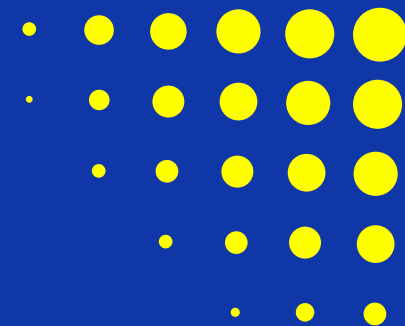
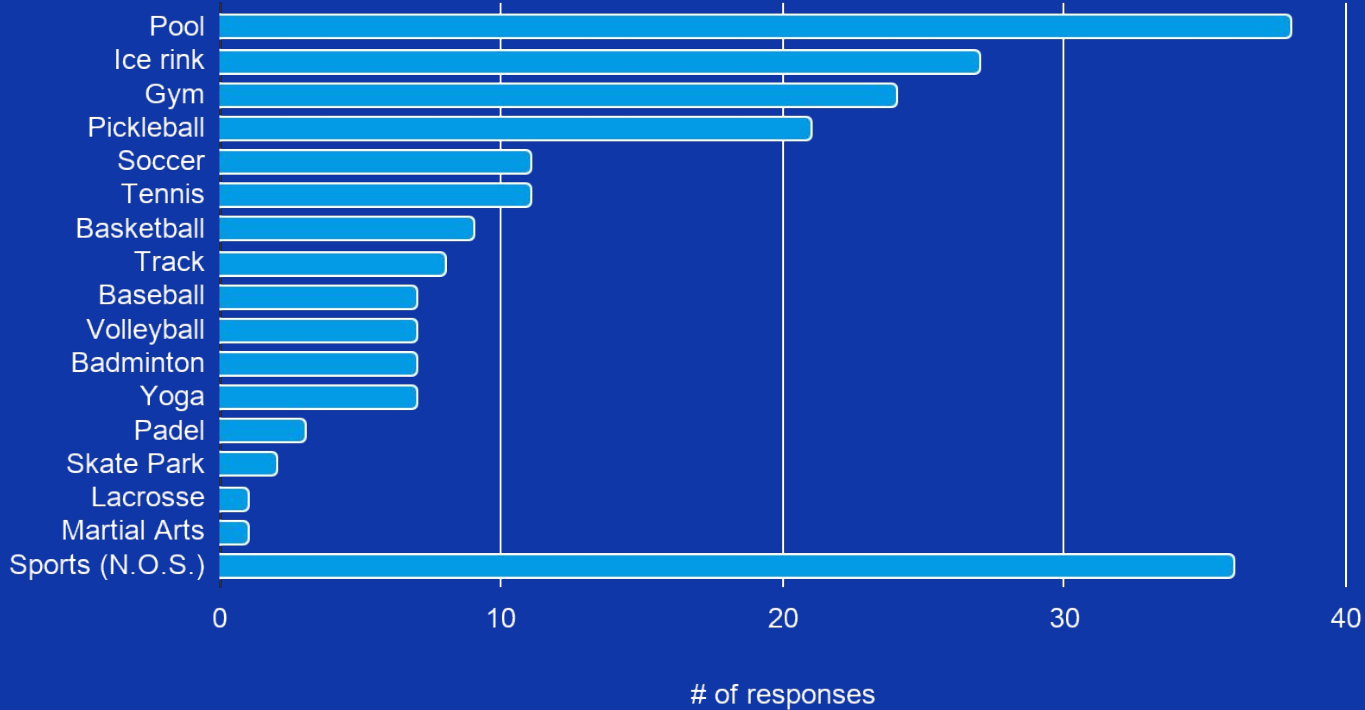

Please don't use Bartlett Pear trees they smell when in bloom and prone to breakage - city may have already stopped using them but there are some around the splash pad in Claudette Cain Park and they're a menace. Use easy to maintain plantings so that City staff can keep them looking good - too often shrub choices in Ottawa's commercial landscaping get overgrown due to lack of pruning or spread by suckers and end up looking messy.
